## Do three learning activities with your child, then visit the library to get their badge!

Read a library book about numbers.Count how many lights you have in different rooms of your house. Talk about which rooms have more lights, and which have less. Do the same with other objects such as windows, doors, and chairs.Write the numbers 1 through 10 on separate pieces of paper. With your child, use items such as beans, dry noodles, stickers, or cereal to count to each number. Put 10 beans on the paper that says 10, etc.Put jelly beans or other small objects in a glass container. Ask your child to guess how many there are, then count them out together!

Have your child help set the table for dinner. Have them help count the number of plates, cups, utensils, and napkins that are needed.

Learning and practicing numbers is a fundamental part of math literacy. Literacy in all areas is important for preparing for schoo!!
