Whatever works is the right way to do it! And if you have more than one child, see if they want to get their favorite stuffed animal and bounce along with you and baby!]

SAMPLE STORYTIME

Starting Song: Open Shut Them

Activity/Game: Go and find your knightly name!

Rhyme/Song: Three Brown Bears

Book Two: Cinnamon by Neil Gaiman

Rhyme/Song: There Was a Princess Long Ago

Book Three: “The Magic Teakettle” from Japanese Children’s Favorite Stories by Florence Sakade
