

Wondrous Wilderness

These activities are intended for children ages 0-5. Complete at least two to earn your badge!

- □ Make leaf rubbing art with your child. Collect leaves and arrange them flat under a sheet of paper. Peel the wrapper off a crayon and rub the side of the crayon on the paper over the leaves.
- ☐ Go on a bird walk with your little one. Talk to them as you explore. What color birds do they see? What are the birds doing? Can they imitate the sounds the birds make?
- Help your child to create an adventure pack for a walk in a park. Talk about what they should have with them and why. Items may include flashlight, snacks, water, binoculars, journal, hat, bug spray, whistle, etc. Gather these items and take them with you on an adventure in a park!
- ☐ Make a field journal to document and preserve items from your outdoor adventure. Have your child draw pictures about their experience and collect any interesting items you find together.
