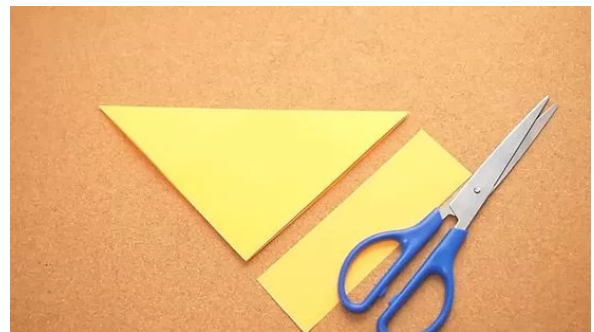
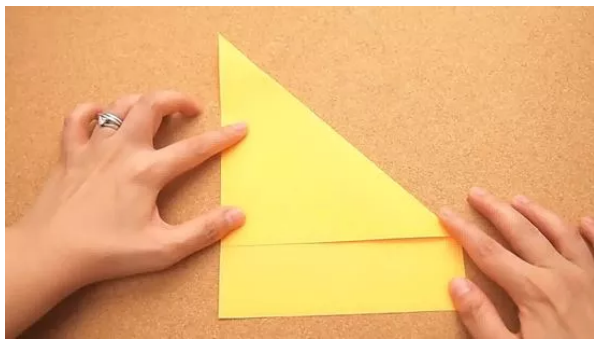


# Make Your Own Paper Snowflakes

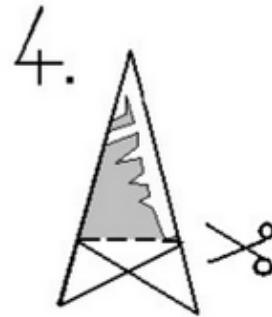
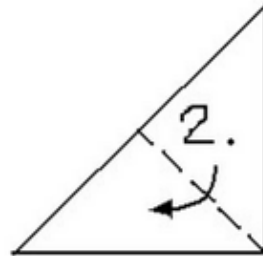
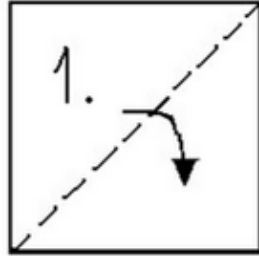
Winter is coming! Follow these instructions to use these templates to cut fun paper snowflakes. String them together to make a garland, suspend them from the ceiling to make a snowy sky inside where it's warm, or just put them up on the fridge.

These templates are designed to be used with a square created using regular 8.5 x 11 inch paper. You can create your own squares using the method shown in the pictures below.



Fold your paper so that it makes a triangle that touches the far side of the paper. Then, cut off the left over rectangle. Open the folded portion and you will have a square!

Create the folds that will make your snowflake using this diagram.



Cut out the template you would like to use and place it on the triangle. Then, use your scissors to cut out the white areas. The black area will form your design. You can also cut out the pattern and then trace it onto the triangle.
